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Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- From May 2022 to May 2023, GSCS will increase the percentage of students scoring proficient learner or distinguished learner in English Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies as measured by at 5 percentage point gain on the College and career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) content mastery district score for each level (elementary, middle, and high).

School Goals and Focus Areas

- During the 2022-2023 school year, Carver Road Middle School will reduce by 40 percentage points the number of students with two or more office discipline referrals.
- During the 2022-2023 school year, 80% of each teachers' median conditional growth percentile (MAP quadrant report) will meet typical growth (typical growth is 41st-66th median Student Growth Percentile) in Reading and/or Math.
- During the 2022-2023 school year, Carver Road Middle School will host three "in person) Carver University events during the 2022-2023 school year (at the end of each nine week grading period).
- During the 2022-2023 school year, Carver Road Middle School will increase the percentage of students in grades 6 through 8 scoring at the projected proficiency and above on MAP Assessment in Math and English Language Arts from Fall to Spring by 7 percentage points.

Teachers, Parents, and Students—Together for Success

Teacher/School Responsibilities:

- Teachers will implement high quality instructional practices where students are engaged in reading, writing, speaking, and solving grade-level work/tasks daily.
- Facilitate and utilize student-led conferences for students to share their progress and goals.
- Provide instructions on how to use Infinite Campus to monitor student progress

Family Responsibilities:

- Will encourage students to read daily at home to increase literacy.
- Will attend student-led conference events to learn ways to support literacy and numeracy.
- Check Infinite Campus to monitor my child's progress in all classes and communicate concerns with his or her teacher.

- Self-evaluate the progress of my goals and be prepared to share at my student-led conference.
- Read at least 20 minutes daily to increase literacy skills.
- Monitor my grades using Infinite Campus to check my progress in all of my classes and communicate concerns with my teacher.
