A School-Parent Compact is a jointly developed agreement with parents. The compact outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and how they will work together as partners to make sure all students reach grade-level standards.

Effective compacts:

- Link to goals of the School Improvement Plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies that parents can do at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

Together, the parents, students and staff of Carver Road Middle School developed this School-Parent Compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students told us what would help them learn. 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## ***Our Goals for Student Achievement***

### ***District Goals***

- Increase by 5% the number of students scoring within or above the Lexile stretch band as measured by the 2019 Georgia Milestones Assessment
- Increase by 5% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in math as measured by the 2019 Georgia Milestones Assessment
- Increase by 5% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in science as measured by the 2019 Georgia Milestones Assessment

### ***School Goals and Focus Areas***

- The percentage of students in grades 6, 7, and 8 scoring level 1 in English language arts will decrease from the 2018 administration of the GA Milestones to the 2019 administration of the GA Milestones by 6%
- The GA Milestones scores will improve in each content area by 3% from 2018 to 2019
